NURSING RESEARCH ABSTRACT CRITERIA:

The Planning Committee expects that each abstract submitter has obtained any necessary local institutional approval(s), e.g. Institutional Review Board (IRB) approval, prior to submission for nursing research. If you have questions regarding IRB approval, contact Julie Basol, Symposium Director:

STEP 1: COMPLETE THE ONLINE SUBMISSION FORM

- As primary author, complete the online form with your contact information and co-presenter name(s), if applicable.
- The online form is to be completed in one sitting. We recommended that you peruse the entire form, gather your information, then cut/paste into the online form: https://bit.ly/15thAnnualCall4Abstracts

STEP 2: ADDITIONAL SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

1. FINANCIAL RELATIONSHIP FORM (FRF)

In addition to completing the online form, a financial relationship form (formerly COI form) is required for all primary authors. This form is online at: www.NursingResearchSym.org.

2. ABSTRACT SUBMISSION

Along with the FRF, submit your one page abstract (in Word format) with formatting as follows:

A) One page, 8.5"x11", Word Format B) 12 Times Roman font C) One inch margins all around.

HEADINGS REQUIRED for NURSING RESEARCH SUBMISSION:

Title & Authors:

 A descriptive title that describes the work done. Primary & co-authors. (abstracts will be blinded prior to review)

Purpose & Background:

- Clear, concise, justified statement of purpose and aims
- Clear research question(s) and/or hypotheses, consistent with purpose & aim (If qualitative or basic, descriptive study, hypotheses are not expected)
- Research questions are expected in all research studies, but may be absent in quantitative studies that use hypotheses
- Rationale given to support that the study addresses an important problem (significance)

Methods:

- Quantitative approach: appropriateness of design, sampling, sample size, procedures (incl. measurement & instruments), power analysis, data analysis, limitations, rigor.
- Qualitative approach: appropriateness of design, sampling, sample size, data collection, analysis procedures, limitations, trustworthiness

Results:

 Clearly stated in relationship to stated research question(s), hypothesis(es) purpose(s)

Discussion/Conclusion:

 Accurate interpretation of results. Research must be completed at the time of the presentation.

Nursing Implications:

- Possible future study
- Impact

EBP & QI

EVIDENCE-BASED PRACTICE & QUALITY IMPROVEMENT ABSTRACT CRITERIA:

Evidence-Based Practice (EBP) presentations must describe the process and outcomes resulting from the critical appraisal and use/translation of the best and most relevant research evidence related to a clinical question that directly influences nursing practice.

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Title & Authors:

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Background & Significance:

 Describes the problem you are addressing and why it is important.

Clinical Question:

 What was the question to be solved or what is the PICO (Patient/Population/Problem, Intervention, Comparison, & Outcome) statement? Author may choose between a PICO or clinical question.

Evidence:

 Describe strategies used to identify pertinent scholarly work and then synthesize the evidence that supported the intervention.

Intervention Implementation:

• Describe what was implemented and the processes used for successful implementation.

Evaluation:

- Describe the project goals and outcomes measured.
- Describe tools used for data collection (surveys, chart abstraction, interviews).

Results:

 Describe the results of your measured outcomes and project goals.

Significance/Conclusion:

 Describe the implications for nursing practice and any conclusions that can be drawn from your methods or results.

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Call for Podium & Poster Abstracts Guidelines & Helpful Hints REVIEW of the EVIDENCE

REVIEW OF THE EVIDENCE PROJECTS:

All nurses and students are welcome to submit abstracts in the Nursing Research or EB/QI categories.

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Title & Authors:

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Introduction to the Clinical Question:

What is the clinical or PICO (Patient/Population/ Problem, Intervention, Comparison, & Outcome) statement? The author may choose between a PICO or clinical question.

Background Information:

Historical significance of the research topic Describes why the work is important

Significance of the Clinical Problem:

Best practices

Current issues with practice or patient care related to the research topic

Theoretical Framework:

Provide a theoretical framework for applying research results to the real world.

Methods:

Describe search strategy, and databases used Search terms used

Results:

Describe the results of the project including whether goals were met.

Recommendations for Nursing Science:

Based on the synthesis of the literature, provide recommendations for nursing practice. This may include:

- Further research
- Educational initiatives
- Policy/QI changes
- Legal/political initiatives
- Practice-based changes
- Other initiatives/changes to improve nursing practice
